It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of our mother early Saturday morning, April 9, 2016. After a traumatic brain injury and prolonged battle with a cancer, she died peacefully in her sleep surrounded by loved ones. She is predeceased by two partners, Donald Weichel and John Hanke.

She is survived by 6 children and their spouses: Cheriee Weichel and Randy Rotheisler, Rae and James King, Zoe Weichel and Bruce Hooles, James and Suzanne Weichel, Tim Weichel and Ted Nowicki; as well as 14 grandchildren, 9 great grandchildren, and countless nephews, nieces and in-laws.

Mom was born in New Westminster to Walter and Isabel Alaric, but spent most of her life in Oliver and always felt it was her home. Evy, as she was known by family and friends, was the youngest, and last surviving member of a family of 17.

She was a devout Catholic who loved reading, chocolate, dancing, quilting, playing dice and cards, (especially bridge in her younger years) walks in the woods (provided the rattlers weren't out) and spending time with family.

A memorial mass will be held for her at Christ the King Catholic Church in Oliver on May 14, at 11:00 AM.
