John enjoyed curling and golfing, playing in many Legion tournaments. He joined the Osoyoos Golf and Country when he retired, and enjoyed many good years practicing and perfecting his skills on the course.

John was a member of the Royal Canadian Legion for over 50 years and the Sons of Scotland when he lived in Richmond.

John played the bagpipes and enjoyed a wee dram with his friends and was often called up to "Pipe the Haggis in' on Robbie Burns Night on January 25th which was

also his birthday.

John will be deeply missed by his family and friends but we are sure he has found a good foursome to join, is taking his beloved little Sasha for a walk and is looking down on us and keeping watch over us.
