Gone far too soon, Kenneth Michael Burnett passed away painlessly December 10, 2021, at Kelowna General Hospital with his wife and mother by his side.

After being employed at General Coach for 30+ years, in 2010 he started working with the crew at Mike's Auto, which he loved very much.

He spent the last 20 years with his wife and family enjoying their cabin at Mt Baldy, skiing with his many friends. After retiring in 2020, he skied nearly every day last season. During his later years, he loved playing with his granddaughter, Ava.

Ken was also deeply loved by his wife's family, having many in-laws that will miss

him very much.

A graveside service will be held at the Oliver Cemetery on 18 December 2021 at 2pm.
